- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota
- 2 university system; to authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell bonds for
- 3 capital projects; and to declare an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from other income, to the North Dakota university system office and to the various entities and institutions under the supervision of the board of higher education for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those entities and institutions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, as follows:

13	SECTION 2. BOARD INITIATIVES. The sum of \$535,306, or so much of the sum as				
14	may be necessary, included in the board initiatives line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this				
15	Act, must be used to support university system and statewide goals linked to the state board of				
16	higher education strategic plan and the higher education roundtable report, as determined by				
17	the board.				
18	SECTION 3. SYSTEM INITIATIVES. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the sum				
19	as may be necessary, included in the system initiatives line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of				
20	this Act, must be used to establish centers of excellence, as determined by the sate board of				
21	higher education, which will provide support for university system instruction, research, and				
22	outreach efforts. The board may establish criteria relating to the allocation of these funds.				
23	SECTION 4. CAMPUS OPERATIONS. The sum of \$299,415,187, or so much of the				
24	sum as may be necessary, included in the campus operations line item in subdivision 1 of				
25	section 1 of this Act, must be used to support the operations of the various institutions and				
26	entities under the control of the state board of higher education, including the university of North				
27	Dakota school of medicine and health sciences. Each institution and entity receiving funds				
28	pursuant to this section must receive at least 95 percent of the 2001-03 biennium general fund				
29	appropriation for operations, as authorized by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly. In order to				
30	determine allocations under this section, the state board of higher	education may consider the			

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long-term finance plan, costs to continue current operations, major new expenditures, other
 available funding sources, and other related criteria established by the board.

SECTION 5. STUDENT GRANT PROGRAMS - APPROPRIATION. The sum of \$6,458,969, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the student grant programs line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used as determined by the state board of higher education for student grant and exchange programs, pursuant to title 15. Any other funds from private, federal, or other sources that become available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for student grant programs. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the student grant programs line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used as determined by the state board of higher education for administration and implementation of a student internship program.

SECTION 6. CAPITAL ASSETS. The sum of \$117,068,750, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the capital assets line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used as determined by the state board of higher education to satisfy outstanding bond obligations, the payment of special assessments, and the repair and construction of capital assets at the various institutions and entities under the control of the board, provided that all funds deposited in an institution's special revenue fund must be allocated to that institution. Each entity must receive at least 95 percent of the 2001-03 biennium general fund capital assets appropriation for extraordinary repairs, as authorized by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly. The balance of the capital assets funding must be allocated by the board based on historical funding, the condition of physical plant facilities, campus needs as reflected in the campus master plans, and the board's long-term finance plan for capital assets. Any major capital project funded from the capital assets line item must be a stand-alone project that will not require future general fund appropriations to complete in order to be functional. An institution may not receive a general fund appropriation in a future biennium for additional operating, maintenance, and repair costs incurred as a result of a building project funded with non-general fund moneys pursuant to this section.

SECTION 7. TECHNOLOGY POOL. The sum of \$26,138,137, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the technology pool line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used for the benefit of the institutions and entities under the control of the

- 1 state board of higher education, as determined by the board. Technology funding allocations
- 2 must be made based on historic funding and the North Dakota university system information
- 3 technology plan. Funds allocated pursuant to this section must be used to support the higher
- 4 education computer network, the interactive video network, the on-line dakota information
- 5 network, and other related technology initiatives as determined by the board.
- 6 **SECTION 8. CONTINGENCY AND CAPITAL EMERGENCY.** The sum of \$296,693, or
- 7 so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the contingency and capital emergency
- 8 line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used to meet unforeseen operations
- 9 or capital asset needs and opportunities, as determined by the state board of higher education,
- 10 at institutions and entities under the control of the board.
- 11 SECTION 9. FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS APPROPRIATION. All
- 12 funds, in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from federal, private, and other
- 13 sources, received by the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher
- 14 education are appropriated to those institutions and entities, for the biennium beginning July 1,
- 15 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- **SECTION 10. EXEMPTION.** The appropriations contained in section 1 of chapter 28 of
- 17 the 2001 Session Laws are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11.
- 18 SECTION 11. UNEXPENDED GENERAL FUND EXCESS INCOME. Any
- 19 unexpended general fund appropriation authority to and any excess income received by the
- 20 institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher education are not subject
- 21 to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds from these appropriations or
- 22 revenues are available and may be expended by those entities, during the biennium beginning
- 23 July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.
- 24 SECTION 12. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION ADJUSTMENTS. The state
- 25 board of higher education is authorized to adjust full-time equivalent positions as needed,
- 26 subject to the availability of funds, for institutions and entities under its control. The university
- 27 system shall report any adjustments to the office of management and budget before the
- 28 submission of the 2005-07 biennium budget request.
- 29 **SECTION 13. TRANSFER AUTHORITY.** If, during the biennium beginning July 1,
- 30 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, the state board of higher education determines that moneys
- 31 allocated to campus operations pursuant to section 4 of this Act are needed to address capital

projects or extraordinary repair needs, funds may be allocated from campus operations to capital assets. Any transfer of funds pursuant to this section must be reported to the office of management and budget.

SECTION 14. STATE FORESTER RESERVE ACCOUNT - BUDGET SECTION

APPROVAL. The estimated income line item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$115,000 from the state forester reserve account, established pursuant to section 4-19-01.2, for construction of equipment and supply storage buildings in Towner and Bottineau. After receiving approval from the budget section, the forest service may obtain and utilize any additional funds, which are appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, to assist in the construction of the equipment and supply storage buildings.

SECTION 15. WATER DEVELOPMENT TRUST FUND. Notwithstanding section 54-27-25, the sum of \$1,456,074, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the contingency and capital emergency line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the water development trust fund and may be spent by the state board of higher education for the purpose of repaying principal and interest on disaster response loans from the Bank of North Dakota, pursuant to section 54-16-13, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.

SECTION 16. STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND. The sum of \$17,258,969, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the competitive research program, system initiatives, and student grant programs line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the student loan trust fund and may be spent by the state board of higher education during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.

SECTION 17. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - PURPOSES. The state board of higher education, in accordance with chapter 15-55, may arrange for the funding of the projects authorized in this section, declared to be in the public interest, through the issuance of self-liquidating, tax-exempt evidences of indebtedness under chapter 15-55, beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2005. Evidences of indebtedness issued pursuant to this section are not a general obligation of the state of North Dakota. Any unexpended balance resulting from the proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness must be placed in a sinking fund to be used for the retirement of the indebtedness. The evidences of indebtedness may be issued for the purpose of financing the following capital projects:

- 3 **SECTION 18. EMERGENCY.** The capital assets line items contained in subdivisions 1
- 4 and 2 of section 1 of this Act and section 17 of this Act are declared to be an emergency
- 5 measure.
