- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to provision of medication at a correctional facility; and to amend and
- 3 reenact section 43-12.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to exemptions from the
- 4 Nurse Practices Act.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

8	Provision of medication - Training requirements - Verification - Rules.			
9	<u>1.</u>	A correctional facility may authorize an employee to provide medication to an		
10		inma	ate of a correctional facility if the employee is:	
11		<u>a.</u>	Licensed or registered under title 43 and is providing the medication within the	
12			scope of practice of the profession for which the individual is licensed or	
13			registered; or	
14		<u>b.</u>	A correctional facility staff member who has successfully completed	
15			medication administration training that has been preapproved by the North	
16			Dakota board of nursing.	
17	<u>2.</u>	<u>lf a c</u>	correctional facility uses a correctional facility staff member to provide	
18		med	lication to an inmate under subdivision b of subsection 1:	
19		<u>a.</u>	The correctional facility staff member may not provide the medication by the	
20			parenteral rate; and	
21		<u>b.</u>	The correctional facility shall provide to the board of nursing verification of	
22			appropriate medication administration training for that correctional facility staff	
23			member.	

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1	<u>3.</u>	The department of corrections and rehabilitation may adopt rules addressing the						
2		provision of medication to inmates.						
3	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
4	4 amended and reenacted as follows:							
5	5 43-12.1-04. Persons exempt from provisions of chapter. This chapter does not							
6	apply to <u>a p</u>	person that is not licensed or registered under this chapter and that is:						
7	1.	Persons who perform A person that performs nursing interventions in cases of						
8		emergency or disaster.						
9	2.	Students A student practicing nursing as a part of an in-state nursing education						
10		program.						
11	3.	Legally A licensed nurses nurse of another state who is in good standing and who						
12		is employed in this state by the United States government or any of its bureaus,						
13		divisions, or agencies.						
14	4.	A nurse licensed by another state or Canada, whose employment requires the						
15		nurse to accompany and care for a patient in transit for health care.						
16	5.	A nurse licensed by another state whose employment by a resident of that state						
17		requires the nurse to accompany and care for the resident in North Dakota.						
18	6.	A person An individual who performs nursing tasks for a family member.						
19	7.	A person who is not licensed under this chapter and who that renders assistance						
20		pursuant to chapter 23-27.						
21	8.	A person licensed or registered under another chapter of this title and carrying out						
22		the therapy or practice for which the person is licensed or registered.						
23	9.	A person who that provides medications, other than by the parenteral route:						
24		a. Within a correctional facility, in compliance with section 1 of this Act;						
25		b. Within <u>a</u> residential treatment centers <u>center</u> for children licensed under						
26		chapter 25-03.2 and North Dakota Administrative Code chapter 75-03-17;						
27	b.	c. Within <u>a</u> treatment or care centers <u>center</u> for developmentally disabled						
28		persons licensed under chapter 25-16;						
29	c.	d. Within a group homes home, a residential child care facilities facility, and or						
30		an adult foster care facilities facility licensed under section 50-11-01 or North						
31		Dakota Administrative Code chapter 75-03-16; or						

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1	d.	e. Within a human service centers center licensed under chapter 50-06.
2	10.	A nurse currently licensed to practice nursing by another jurisdiction:
3		a. Whose practice in another state requires that nurse to attend orientation,
4		meetings, or continuing education in North Dakota;
5		b. Who serves as a guest lecturer or short-term consultant; or
6		c. Who provides evaluation undertaken on behalf of an accrediting organization.
7	11.	An individual, including a feeding assistant, performing nonhands-on tasks while
8		employed in a medicare-funded organization.
9	12.	Upon written notification to the board by an out-of-state nursing program, a student
10		practicing nursing as a part of a nursing education program preparing for initial or
11		advanced licensure as a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse which is
12		approved by a board of nursing and is located in an institution of higher education
13		that offers transferable credit.
