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- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 15-10 and a new section to
- 2 chapter 54-34.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the annual performance and
- 3 accountability report of the state board of higher education, higher education startup funds for
- 4 new programs, and duties of the international business and trade office; and to require
- 5 monitoring by the state board of higher education and a report to the legislative council.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Two new sections to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code arecreated and enacted as follows:

Annual performance and accountability report. In the annual performance and accountability report required under section 15-10-14.2, the state board of higher education shall include an executive summary and information regarding:

- 1. Economic development, including:
  - a. New programs of study approved by the board and whether these programs are responsive to the economic development needs of the state.
  - b. Information regarding how the goals of the system and of each of the institutions of higher education under the control of the board are designed to be responsive to the economic development needs of the state and businesses in the state and data regarding how well these goals are being met. The board shall consult with the department of commerce in determining what data most effectively measures the accomplishment of these goals.
- 2. Student recruitment, including:
  - a. Whether the university system's strategic plan provides for a systemwide plan for out-of-state recruitment of students.

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1	b. Out-of-state recruitment efforts and how these efforts focus on factors specific
2	to the state, such as specially situated trade partner countries, targeted
3	industries, and workforce needs.
4	New program startup - Grant. The state board of higher education shall develop and
5	implement a grant program to assist institutions under its control in funding new program
6	startups. The grants must be awarded on a competitive basis to institutions that are starting
7	new programs in response to emerging fields. In establishing the eligibility guidelines for the
8	grants, the state board of higher education shall provide for a minimum matching fund
9	requirement of one dollar of matching funds for every dollar of state funds provided under this
10	section. The guidelines may allow for in-kind matches if appropriate. The state board of higher
11	education shall consult with the department of commerce and job service North Dakota in
12	determining whether a proposed new program is responsive to an emerging field.
13	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-34.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	created and enacted as follows:
15	International business and trade office - Higher education. The international
16	business and trade office shall work with the state board of higher education to implement
17	strategies to expand international business expertise of students of higher education.
18	SECTION 3. STATE BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION REPORT ON CCBENEFITS -
19	LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REPORT. During the 2007-08 interim, the state board of higher
20	education shall monitor the implementation of the services of ccbenefits, incorporated, by the
21	institutions under the control of the state board of higher education. Before July 1, 2008, the
22	state board of higher education shall report to the legislative council on the status of the
23	implementation of the ccbenefits, incorporated, services, including the status of the
24	implementation at each institution using the services, the level of utilization of the services at
25	the institutional level and at the system level, the feasibility and desirability of expanding the use
26	of the services from use by the community colleges to use by all institutions in order to improve
27	responsiveness of institutions and to improve forecasting efforts of institutions, and
28	recommendations relating to the use of the ccbenefits, incorporated, services. The legislative

council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to

implement the recommendations, to the sixty-first legislative assembly.
