1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-52.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to subgroups under the uniform group insurance program.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

- 6 54-52.1-02. Uniform group insurance program created - Formation into 7 subgroups. In order to promote the economy and efficiency of employment in the state's 8 service, reduce personnel turnover, and offer an incentive to high-grade men and women 9 individuals to enter and remain in the service of state employment, there is hereby created a 10 uniform group insurance program. The uniform group must be composed of eligible and retired 11 employees and be formed to provide hospital benefits coverage, medical benefits coverage, 12 and life insurance benefits coverage in the manner set forth in this chapter. The uniform group 13 may be divided into the following subgroups at the discretion of the board:
- 14 1. Medical and hospital benefits coverage group consisting of active eligible 15 employees and retired employees not eligible for medicare. In determining 16 premiums for coverage under this subsection for retired employees not eligible for 17 medicare, the rate for a non-medicare retiree single plan is one hundred fifty 18 percent of the active member single plan rate, the rate for a non-medicare retiree 19 family plan of two people is twice the non-medicare retiree single plan rate, and the 20 rate for a non-medicare retiree family plan of three or more persons is two and 21 one-half times the non-medicare retiree single plan rate.
- 22 2. In addition to the coverage provided in subsection 1, another coverage option may
 23 be provided for retired employees not eligible for medicare, provided the option
 24 does not increase the implicit subsidy as determined by the governmental

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1		accounting standards board's other postemployment benefit reporting procedure.
2		In offering this additional option, the board may have an open enrollment but
3		thereafter enrollment for this option must be as specified in section 54-52.1-03.
4	<u>3.</u>	Retired medicare-eligible employee group medical and hospital benefits coverage.
5	3. <u>4.</u>	Active eligible employee life insurance benefits coverage.
6	<u>4. 5.</u>	Retired employee life insurance benefits coverage.
7	5. <u>6.</u>	Terminated employee continuation group medical and hospital benefits coverage.
8	6. <u>7.</u>	Terminated employee conversion group medical and hospital benefits coverage.
9	7. <u>8.</u>	Dental benefits coverage.
10	8. <u>9.</u>	Vision benefits coverage.
11	9. <u>10.</u>	Long-term care benefits coverage.
12	10. <u>11.</u>	Employee assistance benefits coverage.
13	11. <u>12.</u>	Retired medicare-eligible employee group prescription drug coverage.
