1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 11-09.1-03 and 11-09.1-04 and subsection 6 of  
2 section 11-09.1-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to county home rule.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 11-09.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **11-09.1-03. Submission of charter to electors.**

7 At least sixty days, but no more than two years, after submission of the charter to the board  
8 of county commissioners, the board of county commissioners shall submit the proposed charter  
9 must be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the county at a special election called by  
10 the board or at a primary or general election. If the proposed charter has been submitted to a  
11 vote of the qualified electors of the county, the board of county commissioners may call a  
12 special election to resubmit the proposed charter to a vote of the qualified electors of the county,  
13 and the special election must take place at least sixty days after the call for the special election.  
14 The board may amend the proposed charter prior to its resubmission to the electors.

15 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 11-09.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
16 amended and reenacted as follows:

17 **11-09.1-04. Ratification by majority vote - Supersession of existing charter and**  
18 **conflicting state laws - Filing of copies of new charter.**

19 If a majority of the qualified electors voting on the charter at the election vote in favor of the  
20 home rule charter, it is ratified and becomes the organic law of the county on the ~~first day of~~  
21 ~~January or July next following the election~~effective date specified in the charter or sixty days  
22 after the election, whichever is later, and extends to all its county matters. The charter and the  
23 ordinances made pursuant to the charter in county matters must be liberally construed to  
24 supersede within the territorial limits and jurisdiction of the county any conflicting state law

1 except for any state law as it applies to cities or any power of a city to govern its own affairs,  
2 without the consent of the governing body of the city. The charter may not authorize the  
3 enactment of ordinances to diminish the authority of a board of supervisors of a township or to  
4 change the structure of township government in any organized civil township, without the  
5 consent of the board of supervisors of the township. No ordinance of a home rule county shall  
6 supersede section 49-22-16. One copy of the charter as ratified and approved must be filed with  
7 the secretary of state; one with the recorder for the county, unless the board of county  
8 commissioners designates a different official; and one with the auditor of the county to remain  
9 as a part of its permanent records. Courts shall take judicial notice of the charter.

10 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 6 of section 11-09.1-04.1 of the North Dakota  
11 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

12 6. If a majority of the qualified electors voting in each county on the charter votes in favor  
13 of the multicounty home rule charter, it is ratified and becomes the organic law of the  
14 multicounty area on the ~~first day of January following the election or other effective~~  
15 date specified in the charter or sixty days after the election, whichever is later.
