Eligible services may include durable medical equipment, assistive technology, independent living, medicare, mental health, occupational therapy and equipment, physical therapy and equipment, speech and language, educational and employment, executive and social skills training programs, transportation, respite care, and home accessibility modifications."

A committee member who is not an ex officio member, designee of an ex officio member, state employee, or legislator is entitled to mileage and expenses as provided by law for state officers and employees, to be paid by the health information technology office. A committee member who is an ex officio member, designee of an ex officio member, state employee, or legislator is entitled to receive that member's regular salary and receive mileage and expenses, to be paid by the employing agency."

"SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 54-59-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

 The health information technology office is created in the department. The health information technology advisory committee shall make recommendations to the health information technology office for implementing a statewidean interoperable health information infrastructure that is consistent with emerging national standards; promote the adoption and use of electronic health records and other health information technologies; and promote interoperability of health information systems for the purpose of improving health care quality, patient safety, and the overall efficiency of health care and public health services."
