1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-32-01, 43-32-02, 43-32-05, 43-32-06.1,

2 43-32-07, 43-32-08.1, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, 43-32-14, 43-32-16, 42-32-17, 43-32-19.1, 43-32-20,

3 43-32-20.1, 43-32-24, 43-32-26, 43-32-27, 43-32-27.1, and 43-32-30 of the North Dakota

4 Century Code, relating to regulation by the state board of psychologist examiners; and to repeal

5 sections 43-32-33 and 43-32-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to applied behavior

6 analysis.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **43-32-01. Definitions.**

- 1. "Applied behavior analyst" means an individual licensed under this chapter as an
- applied behavior analyst. The term does not include a registered applied behavioranalyst.
- "Autism spectrum disorder" means a neurobiological medical condition that includesautistic disorder, Asperger's disorder, pervasive development disorder not otherwise
 specified, Rett's disorder, and childhood disintegrative disorder.

17 3. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.

- 4.3. "Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this
 chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- 20 <u>5.4.</u> "Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological research
- 21 services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term does not
- include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are themselves,
- rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the services,
- 24 regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.

1	6. 5.	"Industrial-organizational psychology resident" means an individual who has met the
2		requirement of subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 43-32-20, is involved in
3		supervised employment in industrial-organizational psychology, and has registered
4		with the board.
5	7.<u>6.</u>	"Licensee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior
6		analyst, or a psychologist.
7	8.<u>7.</u>	"Practice of applied behavior analysis":
8		a. Means the application of the principles, methods, and procedures of the
9		experimental analysis of behavior and applied behavior analysis, including
10		principles of operant and respondent learning. The term includes applications of
11		those principles, methods, and procedures to:
12		(1) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the
13		behavior of individuals diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder;
14		(2) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the
15		behavior of individuals;
16		(3) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the
17		behavior of groups; and
18		(4) Consult with individuals and organizations.
19		b. The term does not include diagnosis, counseling, psychological testing,
20		personality assessment, intellectual assessment, neuropsychological
21		assessment, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, family therapy,
22		coordination of care, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as
23		treatment modalities.
24	9.<u>8.</u>	"Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation, interpretation,
25		or modification of human behavior by the application of psychological principles,
26		methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or eliminating symptomatic,
27		maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing interpersonal relationships, work
28		and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, behavioral health, and mental health. The
29		term includes psychological testing and the evaluation or assessment of personal
30		characteristics, such as intelligence, personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and
31		neuropsychological functioning; counseling, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior

1		analysis and therapy, clinical applications of hypnosis, and other therapeutic		
2		techniques based on psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and		
3		emotional disorder or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as		
4		well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability;		
5		and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term		
6		includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups,		
7		organizations, institutions, and the public regardless of whether payment is received		
8		for services rendered. The term includes supervising others who are engaged in the		
9		practice of psychology.		
10	10.<u>9.</u>	"Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the practice		
11		of psychology.		
12	11.<u>10.</u>	"Psychology resident" means an individual who has met the requirement of		
13		subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 43-32-20, is involved is registered by the board		
14		and is actively engaged in supervised psychological employment, and has registered		
15		with the boardpractice.		
16	12.<u>11.</u>	"Registered applied behavior analyst" or "registrant" means an individual who is		
17		registered under this chapter as a registered applied behavior analyst and is		
18		supervised by a licensed psychologist or applied behavior analyst. The term does not		
19		include an applied behavior analyst.		
20	13.<u>12.</u>	"School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning which is		
21		accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate course of		
22		study in industrial-organizational psychology, psychology, or applied behavior analysis,		
23		as appropriate.		
24	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
25	amende	d and reenacted as follows:		
26	43-3	2-02. State board of psychologist examiners - How appointed - Qualifications.		
27	The	governor shall appoint a state board of psychologist examiners consisting of seven		
28	members, all of whom are residents of the state. One board member must be designated a			
29	public member who is a resident of this state, is at least twenty-one years of age, and is not			
30	affiliated with any group or profession that provides or regulates health care in any form. Of the			
31	remainin	ig six board members, at least one member must be engaged primarily in providing		

- 1 service in psychology <u>or applied behavior analysis</u>, and at least one member must be engaged
- 2 primarily in teaching, training, or research in psychology <u>or applied behavior analysis</u>. Except
- 3 the public member, each member must:
- 4 1. Be a resident of this state.
- 5 2. Be be licensed under this chapter for at least five years.

6 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 43-32-05. Compensation of members Expenses of board and members.
- 9 Each member of the board serves without compensation, but is entitled to receive
- 10 reimbursement for board expenses, mileage, and travel expenses while engaged in the
- 11 performance of board duties as provided in section 54-06-09. The secretary of the board is
- 12 entitled to receive salary or other compensation and allowance for clerical and other expenses
- 13 of the board, as the board determines.
- 14 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 15 amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **43-32-06.1.** Authority to appoint or employ.

17 The board may appoint, contract with, or employ persons to assist the board in carrying out

- 18 its duties under this chapter.
- 19 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 20 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 21 **43-32-07.** Meetings of board Seal of board.

22 The board shall hold at least one regular meeting each year. Additional meetings may be

23 held upon call of the president or at the written request of the governor or of any two members

of the board. The meetings must be held at such places as the board may designate. The board
 must have a seal.

- 26 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 27 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 28 **43-32-08.1.** Continuing education requirements.

29 The board shall adopt rules establishing requirements for the continuing education of <u>all</u>

30 licensees, psychology residents, registrants, and industrial-organizational psychology residents.

31 The board may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license

- 1 or registration issued under this chapter if the licensee or registrant fails to meet applicable
- 2 continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditationSponsors of continuing

education courses, classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by theboard.

5 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-12. Application and fee for licensure and registration.

- 8 The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure and
- 9 registration. A fee is not refundable, in whole or in part, except for failure of the board to hold-

10 examinations at the time originally announced, in which event the entire fee must be refunded-

11 upon demand by the applicant.

12 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is

13 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 **43-32-13.** Annual license and registration fee.

15 Annually, the board shall mail or transmit by electronic mail a renewal notice and application

16 to each licensee and registrant at the address or electronic mail address on file with the board.

17 Before November fifteenth of each year, every licensee and registrant shall <u>apply for renewal on</u>

18 <u>a renewal application form provided by the board and pay to the secretary of the board an</u>

19 annual fee determined by the board by rule. The<u>Upon confirmation by the board the renewal</u>

20 application is complete, the criteria for renewal have been met, and the secretary of the board,-

21 upon receipt of has received payment of the annual fee, the secretary shall issue the licensee or

22 registrant a certificate of annual renewal, which commences on January first. An individual may

23 not hold out as an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior analyst, a

24 registered applied behavior analyst, or a psychologist until the annual fee is paid. The board

25 may deny renewal of the license or registration of an individual who violates this section.

Annually, the board shall mail or electronically mail a renewal notice to each licensee and

27 registrant at the address or electronic mail address on file with the board.

28 **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 **43-32-26. Issuance and display of license.**

6 The board is the sole agency empowered to examine competence in the practice of 7 psychology. A certificate of license or registration issued by the board must show the full name 8 of the licensee, have a serial number, be signed by the president of the board, and be attested 9 by the secretary under the board's adopted seal. The license issued by the board under this 10 chapter must be prominently displayed at the principal place of business at which the licensee 11 practices.

SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-27. Denial - Revocation or suspension of license or registration - Grounds.

- The board, after notice, hearing, and an affirmative vote of at least a majority of board
 members, may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend any license or registration issued or
 applied for under this chapter and may otherwise discipline a licensee, a registrant, or
 an applicant upon proof the applicant, registrant, or licensee:
- 19a.Has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have a direct20bearing upon an individual's ability to serve the public in the practice of21psychology or applied behavior analysis, or if the board finds, after the conviction22of any offense, that an individual is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section2312.1-33-02.1.
- b. Is unable to practice psychology or applied behavior analysis with reasonable
 skill and safety to clients or patients by reason of illness, inebriation, misuse of
 drugs, narcotics, alcohol, chemicals, or any other substance, or as a result of any
 mental or physical condition.
- c. Has impersonated another individual holding a license or registration issued
 under this chapter or allowed another person to use the licensee's license or
 registration.

1		d.	Has used fraud or deception in applying for a license or registration or in taking	
2			an examination under this chapter.	
3		e.	Has allowed the licensee's or registrant's name or license or registration issued	
4			under this chapter to be used in connection with any person who performs	
5			psychological or applied behavior analysis services outside of the area of that	
6			person's training, experience, or competence.	
7		f.	Is legally adjudicated insane or mentally incompetent. The record of the	
8			adjudication is conclusive evidence of that fact.	
9		g.	Has engaged in any form of unethical conduct as defined in ethical principles-	
10			and the code of ethical conduct adopted by the board by rule.	
11		h.	Has become grossly negligent in the practice of psychology or applied behavior	
12			analysis.	
13		i.	Has willfully or negligently violated this chapter.	
14		j.	Has engaged in an act in violation of rules adopted by the board.	
15		k.	Has had a license or registration revoked or suspended or was disciplined in	
16			another jurisdiction.	
17	2.	<u>The</u>	board shall state in writing the board's reason for denying a license or registration.	
18	<u>3.</u>	The	board may assess costs incurred by the board related to investigations and	
19		disc	iplinary actions. By rule, the board may set <u>fees or</u> fines <u>, not to exceed five</u>

In order to pursue an investigation, the board may subpoena and examine witnesses 14 and records, including patient and client records, and may copy, photograph, or take 15 samples of the records. The board may require the licensee, registrant, or psychology 16 resident to give statements under oath, to submit to a physical or psychological 17 examination, or both, by a physician or other qualified evaluation professional selected 18 by the board, if requiring an examination is in the best interest of the public. The 19 patient and client records released to the board are not public records. The board may 20 adopt rules to assign, define duties, and compensate an investigator to assist the 21 board to process a complaint.
- 5. Unless a patient or client release is on file allowing the release of information at the
 public hearing, patient and client records acquired by the board in the board's
 investigation are confidential and closed to the public. All board meetings at which
 patient or client testimony or records are taken or reviewed are confidential and closed
 to the public. If patient or client testimony or records are not taken or reviewed, the
 remainder of the meeting is an open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise
 applicable.

SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **43-32-30.** Persons exempt from this chapter.

2 This chapter does not apply to:

3 1. A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology, industrial-organizational 4 psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or college, if the activities and 5 services are a part of the individual's supervised course of study and are under the 6 supervision of a licensed psychologist who meets the required supervision and 7 continuing education requirements and demonstrates competency in the area of the 8 student's or intern's practice, industrial-organizational psychologist, or applied 9 behavior analyst. The student or intern may not use the title "psychologist", 10 "industrial-organizational psychologist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered 11 applied behavior analyst". The student or intern status and the supervisor must be 12 clearly stated. 13 2. A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when 14 lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the 15 practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational 16 psychology unless the lecturer is licensed or registered under this chapter. 17 3. An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are 18 restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment. 19 This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school 20 psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be 21 established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public-22 instructioneducation standards and practices board. 23 4. A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care 24 profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose 25 scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's 26 profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent 27 to be rendering psychological or applied behavior analysis services. 28 An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in-5. 29 another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if 30 the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's

1		intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to

3	6.	A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that
