1	A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota
2	university system; to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota
3	Century Code, relating to approval of capital projects requested by institutions under the control
4	of the state board of higher education; and to amend and reenact sections 15-10-48, 15-10-49,
5	15-18.2-05, 54-10-22.1, and 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to matching
6	grants for institutions under the control of the state board of higher education, state aid to
7	institutions, protecting donor records from audits of university and college foundations and the
8	cancellation of unexpended appropriations; to repeal chapter 15-10.2 of the North Dakota
9	Century Code, relating to the midwestern higher education compact; to provide for the transfer
10	of funds; to authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell bonds for capital
11	projects; to provide an exemption; to authorize the conveyance of real property owned by the
12	state of North Dakota; to provide for legislative management reports; to provide legislative
13	intent; and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state board of higher education and to the entities and institutions under the supervision of the board, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state board of higher education and the entities and institutions under the control of the board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

The state board of higher education shall retain up to one-quarter of one percent of 24 any grant awarded under this section to assist with administrative expenses incurred 25 in the grant review process. 26 SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 27 and enacted as follows: 28 Capital project and capital lease requests - Maintenance reserve account. 29 An institution under the control of the state board of higher education must receive 1. 30 approval from the legislative assembly before the construction, purchase, lease,

receipt, or utilization of any building or facility.

- 2. An institution under the control of the board must receive approval from the legislative
 assembly before constructing an addition to or renovating a building or facility if the
 cost of the addition or renovation exceeds seven hundred thousand dollars. This
 subsection does not apply to projects authorized by the budget section of the
 legislative management under section 15-10-12.1.
 - 3. An institution under the control of the board may only seek approval from the legislative assembly under subsection 1 or 2 if the building or facility conforms to a campus master plan and space utilization study approved by the board.
 - 4. An institution seeking approval under subsection 1 or 2 shall include funding for maintenance reserves in its request if the estimated cost of the project, or the appraised value of a building or facility being purchased or received, exceeds five million dollars. The maintenance reserve funds must total at least three percent of the cost of the project or the appraised value of the building or facility. If the request is approved by the legislative assembly, the maintenance reserve funds must be deposited in an account under the control of the state board of higher education to be used only for future maintenance costs of the building or facility approved under this section.
 - **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-18.2-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **15-18.2-05.** Base funding Determination of state aid.
 - In order to determine the state aid payment to which each institution under its control is entitled, the state board of higher education shall multiply the product determined under section 15-18.2-04 by a base amount of:
 - 1. \$72.63\\$58.65 in the case of North Dakota state university and the university of North Dakota;
- \$107.33\$86.95 in the case of Dickinson state university, Mayville state university,
 Minot state university, and Valley City state university; and
- 3. \$114.88\$93.03 in the case of Bismarck state college, Dakota college at Bottineau,
 Lake Region state college, North Dakota state college of science, and Williston state
 college.

- SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 54-10-22.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 54-10-22.1. State auditor's access to information relating to operations of governmental entities subject to audit.

Notwithstanding any other specific sections of law, the state auditor and persons employed by the state auditor, when necessary in conducting an audit, shall have access to all information relating to operations of all governmental units or component units subject to audit except active investigatory work product of the attorney general as defined in section 44-04-19.1 and financial records and estate planning records a donor provides to a nonprofit organization affiliated with an institution under the control of the state board of higher education which provides support to and is organized and operated for the benefit of the institution. Except for active investigatory work product of the attorney general as defined in section 44-04-19.1 and tax records as described in section 54-10-24, the state auditor may inspect any state agency's books, papers, accounts, or records that may be relevant to an ongoing audit of any other state agency or computer system audit. The state auditor and persons employed by the state auditor examining any information, which is confidential by law, shall guard the secrecy of such information except when otherwise directed by judicial order or as is otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-44.1-11. (Effective through July 31, 20172019) Office of management and budget to cancel unexpended appropriations - When they may continue.

Except as otherwise provided by law, the office of management and budget, thirty days after the close of each biennial period, shall cancel all unexpended appropriations or balances of appropriations after the expiration of the biennial period during which they became available under the law. Unexpended appropriations for the state historical society are not subject to this section and the state historical society shall report on the amounts and uses of funds carried over from one biennium to the appropriations committees of the next subsequent legislative assembly. Unexpended appropriations for the North Dakota university system are not subject to this section and the North Dakota university system shall report on the amounts and uses of funds carried over from one biennium to the next to subsequent appropriations committees of the legislative assembly. The chairmen of the appropriations committees of the senate and

- 2 appropriations or balances in force for not more than two years after the expiration of the

 - (Effective after July 31, 20172019) Office of management and budget to cancel unexpended appropriations When they may continue. The office of management and budget, thirty days after the close of each biennial period, shall cancel all unexpended appropriations or balances of appropriations after the expiration of the biennial period during which they became available under the law. Unexpended appropriations for the state historical society are not subject to this section and the state historical society shall report on the amounts and uses of funds carried over from one biennium to the appropriations committees of the next subsequent legislative assembly. The chairmen of the appropriations committees of the senate and house of representatives of the legislative assembly with the office of the budget may continue appropriations or balances in force for not more than two years after the expiration of the biennial period during which they became available upon recommendation of the director of the budget for:

- 29 2. Major repair or improvement projects.

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- Purchases of new equipment costing more than ten thousand dollars per unit if it was
 ordered during the first twelve months of the biennium in which the funds were
 appropriated.
 - 4. The purchase of land by the state on a "contract for deed" purchase if the total purchase price is within the authorized appropriation.
 - 5. Purchases by the department of transportation of roadway maintenance equipment costing more than ten thousand dollars per unit if the equipment was ordered during the first twenty-one months of the biennium in which the funds were appropriated.
 - 6. Authorized ongoing information technology projects.
- 10 **SECTION 10. REPEAL.** Chapter 15-10.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
- 11 SECTION 11. ADDITIONAL FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS -
- 12 **APPROPRIATION.** All funds, in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from
- 13 federal, private, and other sources for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative
- 14 assembly has not indicated the intent to reject, including tuition revenue, received by the state
- board of higher education and the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of
- 16 higher education, are appropriated to the board and those institutions and entities, for the
- 17 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. All additional funds received under
- 18 the North Dakota-Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017,
- and ending June 30, 2019, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for
- 20 reimbursement to institutions under the control of the board.
- 21 SECTION 12. CAMPUS CAPITAL PROJECTS PROJECT MANAGEMENT. During the
- biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, each capital project authorized by
- 23 the state board of higher education must have adequate project management oversight by
- either an institution official or a representative of an external entity. An institution may seek
- 25 assistance from the North Dakota university system office for project management oversight of
- 26 a capital project.
- 27 SECTION 13. STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND LEGISLATIVE INTENT. Subdivision 1 of
- 28 section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$1,504,744, or so much of the sum as may be
- 29 necessary, from the student loan trust fund of which \$465,307 is for the professional student
- 30 exchange program, \$500,000 is for grants to tribally controlled community colleges, and

- \$539,437 is for connectND campus solution positions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017,
 and ending June 30, 2019.
- Subdivision 13 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$11,806,856, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the student loan trust fund for residency positions at the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. It is the intent of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly that funding for the residency positions becomes part of ongoing base funding in future budget requests of the school.
 - **SECTION 14. STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP DUES.** Subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$294,000 for membership dues for the western interstate commission for higher education. Subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$230,000 of one-time funding for membership dues of the midwestern higher education compact.
 - SECTION 15. UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL RESEARCH CENTER PAYMENTS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA. During the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, the university of North Dakota may not enter or continue any contractual agreement with the energy and environmental research center which would require the energy and environmental research center to reimburse the university in an amount exceeding five hundred thousand dollars per year for facilities, administrative, or other costs.

20 SECTION 16. TRANSFER AUTHORITY - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT.

- Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the state board of higher education may transfer appropriation authority from the operations to the capital assets line items within subdivisions 2 through 14 of section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The board shall report any transfer of funds under this section to the office of management and budget and the legislative management.

11	liquidating, tax-exempt evidences of indebtedness under chapter 15-55, beginning with the
12	effective date of this section and ending June 30, 2019. Evidences of indebtedness issued
13	pursuant to this section are not a general obligation of the state of North Dakota. Any
14	unexpended balance resulting from the proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness must be
15	placed in a sinking fund to be used for the retirement of indebtedness. The evidences of
16	indebtedness may be issued and the proceeds are appropriated in section 1 of this Act for the
17	following capital projects:

21	SECTION 20. EXEMPTION - STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS. Of the
22	\$25,634,276 appropriated from the general fund in the student financial assistance grants line
23	item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 3 of the 2015 Session Laws, \$4,000,000 is not
24	subject to section 54-44.1-11 and must be canceled by the office of management and budget on
25	the effective date of this section.
26	SECTION 21. TUITION RATE INCREASE LIMITATIONS - BUDGET SECTION
27	APPROVAL.
28	1. Except as provided in this section, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state
29	board of higher education may not increase tuition rates for resident students
30	attending institutions of higher education under its control during the 2017-18
31	academic year by more than four percent as compared to the tuition rate in effect

- during the 2017 spring semester unless the board receives prior budget section approval.
 - 2. Except as provided in this section, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state board of higher education may not increase tuition rates for resident students attending institutions of higher education under its control during the 2018-19 academic year by more than four percent as compared to the tuition rate in effect during the 2018 spring semester unless the board receives prior budget section approval.
 - This section does not apply to tuition rates charged for graduate level programs, including programs offered through the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences, the university of North Dakota school of law, or the North Dakota state university school of pharmacy.
 - 4. This section does not apply to tuition rates for nonresident students attending institutions of higher education under the control of the state board of higher education. For purposes of this section, the residency of students for tuition purposes must be determined under section 15-10-19.1.
 - This section does not apply to tuition rates determined under tuition reciprocity
 agreements entered into by the state board of higher education with other states or
 state education compacts.
 - 6. For purposes of this section, an institution must calculate a resident tuition rate increase based on the tuition rate paid by an average full-time resident student. The state board of higher education may exclude adjustments to a tuition rate resulting from a change in an institution's method of charging tuition, including the consolidation of existing fees into tuition rates or charging tuition based on a per-credit rate, from tuition rate calculations under this section.

SECTION 22. USE OF EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS FUNDING - MATCHING FUNDS.

The capital assets line items in subdivisions 2 through 12 of section 1 of this Act include funding from the general fund for institution extraordinary repairs. An institution shall provide two dollars of matching funds from operations or other sources for each one dollar of extraordinary repairs funding used for a project.

If any of the real property 15 authorized to be conveyed under this section is conveyed, the terms of the conveyance must be 16 determined jointly by the state board of higher education or a designee of the board and the 17 commissioner of university and school lands. North Dakota Century Code sections 54-01-05.2 18 and 54-01-05.5 do not apply to the transfer authorized by this section. 19 SECTION 25. TRANSFER OF LAND AUTHORIZED. The state of North Dakota, by and 20 through the state board of higher education, may convey certain real property known as Ray 21 Richard's golf course or Ray Richard's golf course addition, 3801 demers avenue, lot 1, block 1, 22 and Ray Richard's golf course addition, 3501 demers avenue, lot 2, block 1, in the records of 23 the city of Grand Forks, if determined appropriate by the state board of higher education. If any 24 of the real property authorized to be conveyed under this section is conveyed, the terms of the 25 conveyance must be determined by the state board of higher education or a designee of the 26 board. North Dakota Century Code sections 54-01-5.2 and 54-01-05.5 do not apply to the 27 transfer authorized by this section. 28 SECTION 26. TRANSFER OF DAKOTA INSTITUTE INVENTORY. The parks and 29 recreation department shall transfer the name Dakota institute and all rights, title, interests, and 30 copyrights and up to eighty percent of any remaining inventory of any Dakota institute 31 publication, book, or other document or production, regardless of format, to Bismarck state

- 1 college. Bismarck state college may transfer any rights, title, interests, copyrights, inventory of
- 2 any of the Dakota institute's publications, books, or other documents or productions, regardless

4 SECTION 27. RESEARCH NETWORKS - REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE

- 20 addresses workforce and education needs of the state. As part of the study, the board shall
- 21 consider:

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- Shared administration;
- Shared courses, including a common course catalog;
- 3. Articulation agreements linking elementary and secondary education, career
- academies, and career and technical education to postsecondary certificates and
- 26 associate's degrees;
- 4. Centralized processing of student admissions, housing applications, financial aid, and
- 28 advising; and
- 29 5. Centralized services, including bookstore operations, food services, marketing,
- procurement, accounting, and human resources.
