- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.2 and 15.1-21-02.3 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to high school graduation and curriculum requirements.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15.1-21-02.2. High school graduation Minimum requirements.
- 1. Except as provided in section 15.1-21-02.3 <u>and subsection 2</u>, the following twenty-two
 units of high school coursework constitute the minimum requirement for high school
 graduation:
- 10 <u>1. a.</u> Four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature, composition, and speech;
- 12 <u>2. b.</u> Three units of mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science approved by the superintendent of public instruction;
- 14 3. c. Three units of science, consisting of:
- 15 a. (1) (a) One unit of biology;
- 16 (2) (b) One unit of chemistry; and
- 17 (3) (c) One unit of physics; or
- 18 b. $\frac{(1)(2)}{(a)}$ One unit of biology;
- 19 (2) (b) One unit of physical science; and
- 20 (3) (c) One unit or two one-half units of any other science;
- 21 4. d. Three units of social studies, including:
- 22 a. (1) One unit of United States history;
- 23 b. (1)(2) (a) One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of economics; or

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- 1 One unit of problems of democracy; and (2) <u>(b)</u> 2 <u>(3)</u> One unit or two one-half units of any other social studies, which may include C. 3 civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, North Dakota 4 studies, psychology, sociology, and world history; 5 One unit of physical education; or 5. a.<u>e.</u> (1) 6 b. amended and reenacted as follows:

1. If after completing at least two years of high school a student has failed to pass at least one-half unit from three subsections in subsection 1 of section 15.1-21-02.115.1-21-02.2 or has a grade point average at or below the twenty-fifth percentile of other students in the district who are enrolled in the same grade, the student may request that the student's career advisor, guidance counselor, or principal meet with the student and the student's parent to determine if whether the student should be permitted to pursue an optional high school curriculum, in place of the requirements set forth in section 15.1-21-02.115.1-21-02.2. If a student's parent consents in writing to the student pursuing the optional high school curriculum, the student is eligible to receive a high school diploma upon completing the following requirements:
