1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.2 and 15.1-21-02.3 of the North
2 Dakota Century Code, relating to high school graduation and curriculum requirements.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **15.1-21-02.2. High school graduation - Minimum requirements.**

7 1. Except as provided in section 15.1-21-02.3 and subsection 2, the following twenty-two
8 units of high school coursework constitute the minimum requirement for high school
9 graduation:

10 4. a. Four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,
11 composition, and speech;

12 2. b. Three units of mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science
13 approved by the superintendent of public instruction;

14 3. c. Three units of science, consisting of:

15 a. (1) (a) One unit of biology;

16 (2) (b) One unit of chemistry; and

17 (3) (c) One unit of physics; or

18 b. (1)(2) (a) One unit of biology;

19 (2) (b) One unit of physical science; and

20 (3) (c) One unit or two one-half units of any other science;

21 4. d. Three units of social studies, including:

22 a. (1) One unit of United States history;

23 b. (1)(2) (a) One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of
24 economics; or

- 1 (2) (b) One unit of problems of democracy; and
- 2 e. (3) One unit or two one-half units of any other social studies, which may include
- 3 civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, North Dakota
- 4 studies, psychology, sociology, and world history;
- 5 5. a-e. (1) One unit of physical education; or
- 6 b. (2) One-half unit of physical education and one-half unit of health;
- 7 6. f. Three units of:
- 8 a. (1) Foreign languages;
- 9 b. (2) Native American languages;
- 10 e. (3) Fine arts; or
- 11 d. (4) Career and technical education courses; and
- 12 7. g. Any five additional units.
- 13 2. If approved by the board of a school district or nonpublic school, a school district or
- 14 nonpublic school may develop eligibility criteria or programmatic requirements to allow
- 15 a passing score on the relevant portions of the GED assessment to satisfy receive
- 16 credit for the corresponding requirements of subdivisions a through d of subsection 1.

17 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is

18 amended and reenacted as follows:

19 **15.1-21-02.3. Optional high school curriculum - Requirements.**

- 20 1. If after completing at least two years of high school a student has failed to pass at
- 21 least one-half unit from three ~~subsections~~subdivisions in subsection 1 of section
- 22 ~~15.1-21-02.1~~15.1-21-02.2 or has a grade point average at or below the twenty-fifth
- 23 percentile of other students in the district who are enrolled in the same grade, the
- 24 student may request that the student's career advisor, guidance counselor, or principal
- 25 meet with the student and the student's parent to determine if whether the student
- 26 should be permitted to pursue an optional high school curriculum, in place of the
- 27 requirements set forth in section ~~15.1-21-02.1~~15.1-21-02.2. If a student's parent
- 28 consents in writing to the student pursuing the optional high school curriculum, the
- 29 student is eligible to receive a high school diploma upon completing the following
- 30 requirements:
