- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a North Dakota scholarship; to amend and reenact

3 sections 15-10-59, 15.1-21-02.6, 15.1-21-02.8, and 15.1-21-02.9 of the North Dakota Century

4 Code, relating to references to the North Dakota scholarship, North Dakota academic

5 scholarship, and North Dakota career and technical education scholarship; to repeal sections

6 15.1-21-02.4 and 15.1-21-02.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota

7 academic and career and technical education scholarships; and to provide an effective date.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 12 The state board of higher education shall provide to the legislative management an annual

16	public instruction.
17	SECTION 10. REPEAL. Sections 15.1-21-02.4 and 15.1-21-02.5 of the North Dakota
18	Century Code are repealed.
19	SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 2, 5, 7, 9, and 10 of this Act become effective
20	on July 31, 2024.
