- 3 Code, relating to scholarship eligibility requirements and amounts for students; to repeal section
- 4 15.1-21-02.7 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to scholarships for 2009-10 high
- 5 school graduates; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 15.1-21-02.4. North Dakota career and technical education scholarship. (Effective
- 10 through July 31, 2021)

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- Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11 school year and any resident student who completes a program of home education supervised in accordance with chapter 15.1-23 during or after the 2012-13 school year is eligible to receive a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship provided the student:
- Completed four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,
 composition, and speech;
- 17 2. Completed three units of mathematics, including:
- a. One unit of algebra II, <u>integrated math II, or integrated math III,</u> as defined by the superintendent of public instruction; and
- 20b. Two units of any other mathematics, which may include one unit of computer21science;
- 22 3. Completed three units of science, consisting of:
- a. (1) One unit of biology;

The state board shall monitor each scholarship recipient to ensure that the student 12 meets the academic and other requirements of this section. Upon determining that a 13 recipient student has failed to meet the requirements of this section, the board shall 14 provide notification to the student within ten business days. 15 3. A student is not entitled to receive more than six thousand dollars under this section. 16 4. The state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the 17 institution in which the student is enrolled. 18 5. a. (1) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive 19 semesters. 20 (2) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive, 21 quarters, or clock-hour terms. 22 A scholarship under this section is valid only for six academic years after the b. 23 student's graduation from high school and may be applied to a graduate or 24 <u>professional</u> program. A scholarship under this section is available to any eligible resident student who fulfills 25 6. 26 the requirements of section 15.1-21-02.4 or 15.1-21-02.5 and who: 27 Graduates from a high school in this state; a. 28 Graduates from a high school in a bordering state under chapter 15.1-29; b. 29 Graduates from a nonpublic high school in a bordering state while residing with a C. 30 custodial parent in this state; or

For purposes of North Dakota scholarship eligibility under this section, "full-time" 4 has the same meaning as the term is defined by the institution the student is 5 attending. 6 b. A student who is enrolled less than full-time may retain scholarship eligibility if the 7 student is in the final semester or, quarter, or clock-hour term before 8 graduation program completion. The waiver of the full-time enrollment status 9 requirement for scholarship eligibility may not apply to a student more than once. 10 For the purpose of North Dakota scholarship eligibility under this section, 11 "progress toward degreeprogram completion" means earning the following 12 minimum number of credits after each semester or, quarter, or clock-hour term 13 disbursement to qualify for the subsequent disbursement: 14 Twenty-four credits after disbursement two: 15 (2) Thirty-nine credits after disbursement three: 16 Fifty-four credits after disbursement four; (3) 17 (4) Sixty-nine credits after disbursement five; 18 (5) Eighty-four credits after disbursement six; and 19 Ninety-nine credits after disbursement seven. 20 For purposes of scholarship eligibility under this section, "clock-hour term" has the <u>8.</u> 21 same meaning as the term is defined by the state board of higher education. The state 22 board of higher education shall determine the conversion of: 23 Clock hours to credit hours; and <u>a.</u> 24 <u>b.</u> Percentage-based grading to grade point average. 25 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.8 of the North Dakota Century Code is 26 amended and reenacted as follows: 27 15.1-21-02.8. North Dakota scholarship - Eligibility - One-time exception. 28 Notwithstanding section 15.1-21-02.6, if a student's cumulative grade point 1. a. 29 average as determined by the state board of higher education at the conclusion 30 of a semester, quarter, or clock-hour term is below 2.75, the board shall grant an 31 exception and provide the North Dakota scholarship to which the student would

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1 otherwise be entitled for the next semester, quarter, or clock-hour term in which 2 the student is enrolled full time. The exception provided by this section is 3 applicable to a student only one time. 4 b. If a student's cumulative grade point average as determined by the state board of 5 higher education at the conclusion of a semester, quarter, or clock-hour term is 6 below 2.75 for a second time, the student is no longer eligible to receive any 7 additional North Dakota academic or career and technical education 8 scholarships. 9 2. Notwithstanding section 15.1-21-02.6, if a student's cumulative grade point a. 10 average as determined by the state board of higher education at the conclusion of a 11 quarter is below 2.75, the board shall grant an exception and provide the North Dakota-12 scholarship to which the student would otherwise be entitled for the next quarter in-13 which the student is enrolled full time. The exception provided by this section is 14 applicable to a student only one time. 15 If a student's cumulative grade point average as determined by the state board-16 of higher education at the conclusion of a quarter is below 2.75 for a second time, the 17 student is no longer eligible to receive any additional North Dakota academic or career 18 and technical education scholarships For purposes of scholarship eligibility under this 19 section, "clock-hour term" has the same meaning as the term is defined by the state 20 board of higher education. The state board of higher education shall determine the 21 conversion of: 22 Clock hours to credit hours; and a. 23 Percentage-based grading to grade point average. <u>b.</u>
