This bill would not allow the use of a social security number on a game and fish license or permit application unless requested by the applicant. The bill would put the state out of compliance with federal mandates for the child support enforcement (IV-D) program resulting in the loss of federal funds used in the program and the incentives that are earned. Under 42USC666(a)(13), the state must have in effect laws requiring that a social security number be recorded on the application for a recreational license. A valid IV-D program is required for the TANF program to be in compliance with Title IV-A regulations. Therefore, the bill would also risk the loss of the TANF block grant funds. The potential loss of total revenue to the Department could amount to \$73.1 million.
