

 Provides funding for state employee salary increases, of which \$557,276 relates to performance increases and \$281,131 is for market equity adjustments. The House added funding of \$26,212 to correct the executive compensation package and reduced funding for performance and market equity adjustments by \$371,058. \$469,508 \$368,899

Other Sections in Bill

Transfer to minor use fund - Section 2 transfers \$325,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund during the 2013-15 biennium. The executive budget recommended a transfer of \$200,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund during the 2013-15 biennium.

Game and fish funding - Section 4 provides \$484,398 from the game and fish operating fund for the State Board of Animal Health (\$99,998) and Wildlife Services program (\$384,400) for the 2013-15 biennium. The executive budget recommended total funding of \$968,796 from the game and fish fund for these programs. The 2011-13 legislative appropriations from the game and fish fund for these programs was \$1,068,261.

State Water Commission funding - Section 5 provides that \$250,000 be transferred from the State Water Commission to the Agriculture Commissioner for the Wildlife Services program for the 2013-15 biennium. This represents the same level of funding transferred from the State Water Commission to the Agriculture Commissioner during the 2011-13 biennium.

Johne's disease funding carryover - Section 6 provides an exemption to North Dakota Century Code Section 54-44.1-11 to allow the Agriculture Commissioner to continue 2011-13 biennium appropriations for Johne's disease control into the 2013-15 biennium.

Agriculture Commissioner's salary - Section 7 includes the statutory changes necessary to increase the commissioner's salary as follows:

The executive recommendation provides funding for elected officials' salary increases equal to 4 percent of salaries effective July 1, 2013, and 4 percent effective July 1, 2014. The House version provides funding for elected officials' salary increases of 3 percent effective July 1, 2013, and 3 percent effective July 1, 2014.

Commercial feed inspection, license, and registration fees - Section 8 deposits the first \$485,000 of commercial feed inspection, license, and registration fees in the environment and rangeland protection fund rather than the general fund. A total of \$990,000 of commercial feed fees is estimated to be collected during the 2013-15 biennium.

Milk Marketing Board study - Section 9 provides for a Legislative Management study of the Milk Marketing Board during the 2013-14 interim.

Honey promotion fund - Chapter 4.1-08 - Commodity checkoff for market development of honey

Turkey fund - Chapter 4.1-12 - Commodity checkoff for market development of turkeys and turkey products

Minor use pesticide fund - Section 4-35-06.3 - For studies, investigations, and evaluations regarding registration and use of pesticides

Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1247 - Agriculture wetland credit program - Requires the Agriculture Commissioner to implement a program which provides credits to landowners for the restoration of a wetland and allows the sale of credits to other landowners removing wetlands.

Senate Bill No. 2146 - Grape and wine industry grants - Provides a \$100,000 general fund appropriation and a \$100,000 appropriation from the agricultural fuel tax fund to the Agriculture Commissioner for grape and wine industry grants.

- Reduces the performance component from 3 to 5 percent per year to 2 to 4 percent per year.
- Reduces the market component from 2 to 4 percent per year for employees below the midpoint of their salary range to up to 2 percent for employees in the first quartile of their salary range for the first year of the biennium only.
- Removes funding for additional retirement contribution increases.

This amendment also:

- Increases the transfer from the environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use fund from \$200,000 to \$325,000.
- Adds a section to deposit the first \$485,000 of commercial feed license, inspection, and registration fees received under Chapter 19-13.1 in the environment and rangeland protection fund rather than the general fund.
- Provides for a Legislative Management study of the Milk Marketing Board.
- Changes the statutory salary for the Agriculture Commissioner to provide for a 3 percent annual increase rather than a 4 percent annual increase as recommended in the executive budget.

² This amendment adjusts the state employee compensation and benefits package as follows:

³ A portion of salaries and wages funding from the general fund (\$132,719) and from other funds (\$104,576) for permanent employees compensation and benefits is reallocated to an accrued leave payments line item for paying annual leave and sick leave for eligible employees.

⁴ Funding included in the executive budget recommendation for a grant to the Centennial farms program is removed.
