Selected Bill Sections Included in the First Chamber Version

Grants, gifts, and donations - Section 3 identifies \$100,000 of funds in the grants, gifts, and donations line item received by the Game and Fish Department for surface damage, easements, or reclamation of department-owned or department-managed properties from oil or mining activities.

Recovering America's Wildlife Act - Section 4 authorizes 7 FTE positions and \$27,150,000 from other funds to the Game and Fish Department for the purpose of administering programs approved under the federal Recovering America's Wildlife Act. The funding and positions authorized in this section are available only upon passage of the federal Recovering America's Wildlife Act.

Line item transfer authority - Section 5 authorizes the Office of Management and Budget to transfer up to \$2 million of appropriation authority between the operating expenses, capital assets, and grants - game and fish line items during the 2023-25 biennium. The department must report any transfers to the Legislative Council.

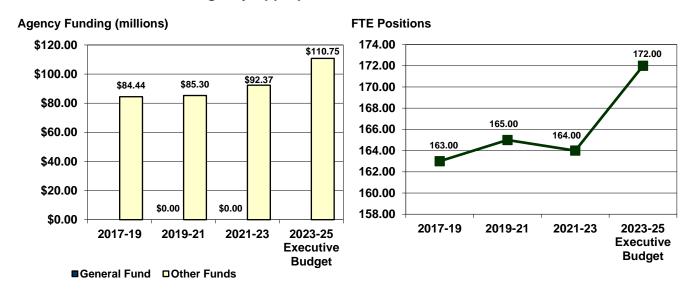
