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LEGISLATIVE DOCUMENT PRINTING SERVICES

Numerous legislative documents are generated during a regular or special legislative session. The Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee is tasked with making arrangements for how certain documents will be made available to legislators, Legislative Assembly staff, and members of the public.

BILL AND JOURNAL ROOM STAFF AND SERVICES

The Bill and Journal Room, which is located on the ground floor of the legislative wing, historically has served as a main access point for receiving legislative documents. In the past, the Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee would invite outside employment contractors to submit bids for the provision of secretarial services, telephone message services, and Bill and Journal Room services. The contracted Bill and Journal Room staff were responsible for receiving copies of bills, resolutions, daily journals, daily calendars, committee hearing schedules, and bill status reports from a separately contracted printing provider. Staff would stock copies of these documents in the Bill and Journal Room, provide copies of documents to individuals at the walkup window of the Bill and Journal Room, maintain a document subscription list, assemble subscription materials, and receive subscription fees. Contracted staff operated the Bill and Journal Room through the 2019 legislative session. Beginning with the 2021 legislative session, Legislative Assembly staff began operating the Bill and Journal Room. The number of staff devoted to the Bill and Journal Room has decreased due to the reduced need for printed copies as a result of documents being readily available online.

PRINTING POLICY AND SUBSCRIPTION SERVICES

Pursuant to Joint Rule 603 (appendix), Bill and Journal Room staff may distribute legislative documents to legislators, House and Senate employees, and Legislative Council staff free of charge. Members of the public may request House and Senate daily journals, House and Senate calendars, House and Senate committee hearing schedules, and up to five copies of a limited number of bills and resolutions free of charge. For other documents or requesters, a printing fee of 25 cents per page is charged and remitted to the Legislative Council office for deposit in the legislative services fund pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 54-35-19. Fifty-three dollars in printing fees were collected during the 2023 legislative session.

Beginning in 1986, members of the public who wished to receive a complete set of certain types of legislative documents had the option of paying a subscription fee. The Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee is tasked with establishing the subscription fee for each document type. The following table provides a recent history of the number of subscribers outside of the legislative branch and the fees charged under the document subscription program:

The 2021-22 interim Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee elected to suspend the subscription program for the 2023 legislative session due to the dwindling number of subscribers. The committee may wish to consider whether it would like to permanently eliminate the document subscription program due to the ease of obtaining legislative documents online.

CONTRACTED PRINTING SERVICES AND COSTS

A contracted printer is used to preprint a set number of copies of legislative documents for the Bill and Journal Room for distribution to House and Senate staff, legislators, and the public. Copies in addition to those provided by the contract printer are printed by the Bill and Journal Room staff on demand. Before the 2021 legislative session, Section 46-02-05 required the Office of Management and Budget to issue an invitation for printing bids before each legislative session. Two separate requests for printing bids were issued before the 2021 legislative session, but no bids were received. As a result, the 2021-22 interim Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee recommended a bill draft to allow the Legislative Assembly to enter an agreement with Central Duplicating Services of the Office of Management and Budget to print legislative documents. Senate Bill No. 2347 passed during the 2021 special legislative session and allows the Legislative Assembly to have legislative materials printed by Central Duplicating Services or solicit bids from a private printing vendor for printing services. Central Duplicating Services served as the contracted printing provider during the 2021 and 2023 legislative sessions.

The following table provides the number of documents requested from Central Duplicating Services and the cost of those documents for the 2021 and 2023 legislative sessions:

¹The 2021-22 interim Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee approved a motion for bills, resolutions, daily journals, the journal index, and Bill Status Reports to be printed only upon request during the 2023 legislative session, except as required by House and Senate Rules 204.

The practice of printing bills and resolutions, daily journals, and *Bill Status Reports* on demand worked well during the 2023 legislative session and resulted in substantial printing savings. The committee may wish to consider whether it would like to continue the practice of preprinting a set count of daily calendars and committee hearing schedules, or if the committee would like to move to an on-demand printing approach for those materials as well.

LEGISLATIVE AREA PRINTER RENTALS AND COSTS

In addition to materials preprinted through contracted printing services, certain legislative areas are equipped with network-connected printers to perform on-demand printing. Since the 2015 legislative session, a printer rental arrangement has been used because rental machines have been found to be more dependable and produce higher quality print jobs. The following is a comparison of copies made and costs incurred from the 2015 through 2023 legislative sessions in each area in which printer was placed.
